Background: Caring for Cambodia is a non-profit organization that serves 7,000 students from Preschool-12th and is dedicated to improving the quality of education in Cambodia. With a strong focus on gender equality and female empowerment, CFC strives to ensure that all children, regardless of gender, have equal access to quality education and

that our teachers have the resources necessary for success. Girls make up fifty percent of Caring for Cambodia's 7,000 students.

There are many barriers to education in a developing nation such as Cambodia, barriers that seem insignificant to us but loom large in the lives of CFC students. One of those barriers is access to early childhood education.

Thanks to our 12 preschools and kindergarten program, CFC is a national leader in early learning. Our preschools lead the country in best practices and early enrollment, making it more likely young students will stay in school, achieve, and go on to graduate.

Designed to support mothers and teach them skills they were not able to learn from their own families due to genocide and poverty, CFC provides children and families with resources for health, nutrition, early skills-building, and more.

Often operating in community centers or space donated by a village leader, CFC teachers provide children and families with resources for health, nutrition, early skills-building and more. CFC schools enroll more preschoolers than five other provinces combined. 93% of CFC preschool parents enroll their children by age 5, compared to just 33% nationwide.

Project Goal: Ensure access to quality preschool and kindergarten education for as many Cambodian youth and families as possible. Empower CFC and local educators with innovative teaching techniques and resources to give Cambodia's most disadvantaged communities the tools necessary to rise out of poverty by shifting rural parents' attitudes, expanding engagement with the community, and creating sustainable change.
